

AN ACT

To provide penalties for traffic law violations by chauffeur and operator license holders and related matters.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE NITIJELA OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS:

1 Section 1. Short title.

2 This Act may be cited as the Chauffeur and Operator License
3 (Amendment) Act 1984.

4 Section 2. Amendment of D.L. 23-34-2 and 83 TTC Chapter 5.

5 (1) D.L. 23-34-2 is amended by inserting at the end of -

6 (a) Section 1, the following -

7 "The chauffeur license is a class of operator
8 license for the purposes of 83 TTC, subject to
9 Section 2A of this Act."

10 (b) Section 2, the following -

11 "Section 2A. Term.

12 (1) 83 TTC (1980 Edn.) Section 160 does not
13 apply to the term of the chauffeur license.

14 (2) The chauffeur license is valid for one
15 year from the date of issue unless suspended
16 or revoked."

17 (2) The first reference in D.L. 23-43-2, Section 3 to the
18 district chief of police is omitted and "any court of competent jurisdiction"
19 is substituted.

20 (3) 83 TTC Chapter 5, (1980 Edn.) is amended by adding a
21 penalty section as follows:

1 "219 Penalties.

2 (1) Any person who violates 83 TTC, (1980 Edn.)
3 Sections 212 or 213 is liable for a fine of not more
4 than \$1,000 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding
5 one year, or both.

6 (2) Any person who violates 83 TTC (1980 Edn.),
7 Sections 202, 204, 205, 206, 207, 208, 109, 110,
8 211, 214, 215, 216, 218, 251, 252, or 253 is liable,
9 in addition to possible suspension or revocation
10 of license, for a fine of not more than \$200 or
11 imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months
12 or both."

13 (4) 83 TTC (1980 Edn.), Section 161 is amended by inserting
14 after the first sentence the following:-

15 "Upon a preliminary finding of criminal violation,
16 the Police Chief shall suspend and take possession
17 of a license until a final court decision is made."

18 Section 3. Effective date.

19 This Act becomes effective on the date on which it becomes law.
